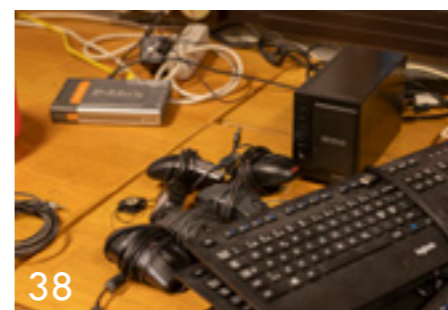

THE HOMELESS IN

THE BITING COLD

The thermometer has tipped to -23°C , and I have just been to the store to buy dinner for tonight. The cold outside is dreadful, and with every breath, I can feel the piercing pain of the cold air deep in my chest. Even with gloves on, my fingers and joints ache, feeling like stiff, frozen icicles.

Fortunately for me, my shared living space is just around the corner, and I can soon warm myself in front of our wood stove. However, not everyone is as fortunate as I am. As many as 3000 Norwegians are now wandering around in this biting cold without shelter and a warm home to return to.

The thought of all those people forced to stay outside pains me incredibly. I am left with several questions: Who are these people? What is the reason they don't have a home, and what is our society doing for those of us who are homeless?

The truth is that we are doing a lot, but still not enough.

When the cold was at its worst earlier in January, Oslo Central Station was kept open for the homeless in the city. According to Bane NOR, 30 people stayed overnight at the station from Saturday to Sunday, with some people outside being offered a place inside.

Normally, the Red Cross and the Church City Mission operate a year-round shelter for the homeless. The Salvation Army also has emergency shelter on nights when it is so cold that sleeping outdoors poses a health risk. Unfortunately, there is not

enough space for everyone, and dozens are turned away daily.

Even though they do their best, the Red Cross has been criticized several times for their shelter system. The issue is that the system is based on a lottery where you must draw the right token to be allowed to stay indoors.

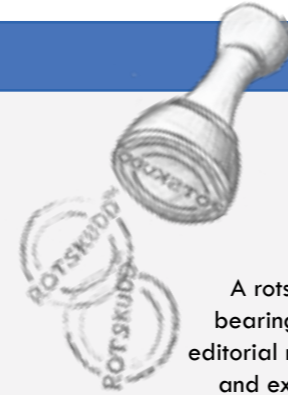
Drawing a green token means you can sleep inside, and if you draw a red one, you must stay outside. Since it's random whether you draw a red or green token, the system is supposedly "fair." However, the system fails to see the individuals, and people with health problems end up being denied access and forced to sleep outside.

In 2019, NRK published the article "The Homeless," sharing the story of an elderly couple. The man had health problems, and if he drew a red token and his wife drew a green one, she chose to sleep outside with him to take care of him.

Those who don't find a place to sleep indoors must find other solutions. In the

summer, many might prefer to sleep in a park, but this became illegal in Oslo in 2013. As a result, many have to resort to sleeping in everything from public toilets to under busy roads. A popular spot is between the boulders under Sinsen subway station. I believe this is undignified and heartless.

We not only have a moral responsibility to improve their living situation but also a legal responsibility. According to the Sosialtjenesteloven § 27, municipalities



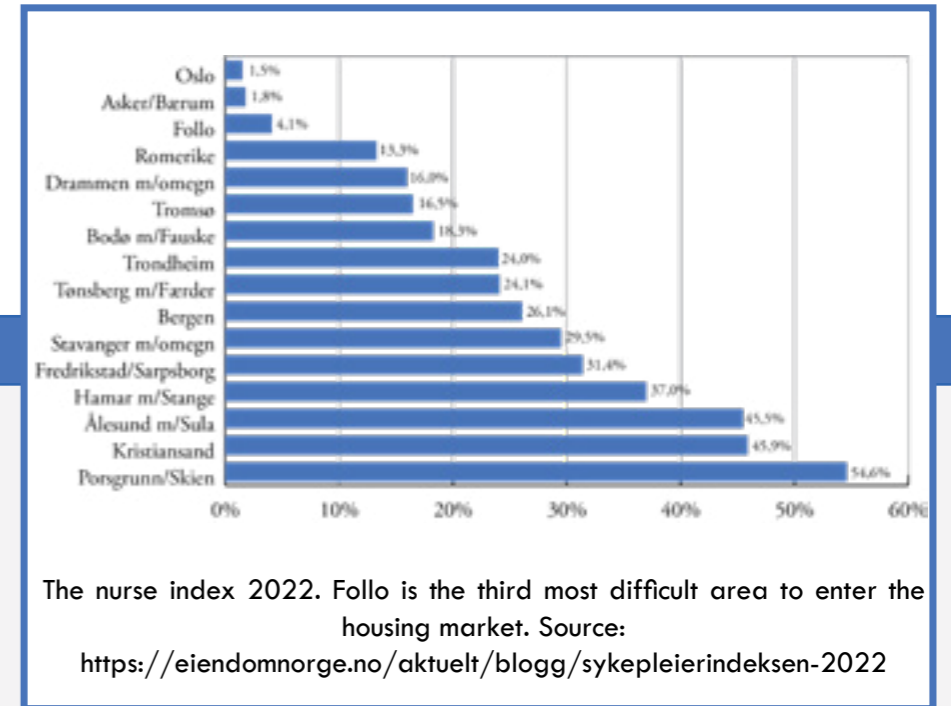

are obliged to provide temporary housing for those who cannot do it themselves. However, in several places, homeless people do not receive a dignified offer, and municipalities neglect their duty.

It's essential to remember that homelessness exists in all municipalities. It is particularly prevalent in our major cities such as Oslo, Bergen, Trondheim, and Stavanger, but we must not forget that it also exists in places like Ås.

Fortunately, the number of people without a home is continually decreasing. Since 2016, the number of homeless has been reduced by 15 percent, and since 1996, it has decreased by 46 percent. According to researcher Evelyn Dyb at OsloMet, this is because municipalities have systematically worked over a long period to reduce homelessness.

One of the challenges we face is that today's housing market is difficult to enter. One way to address this is through the nurse index. This refers to the percentage of homes in an area that a single nurse with an



The nurse index 2022. Follo is the third most difficult area to enter the housing market. Source:

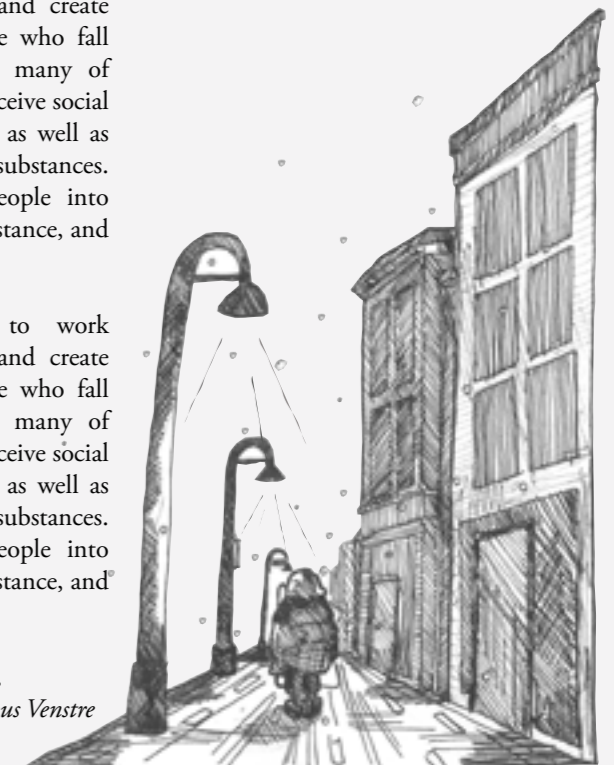

average salary can afford. In 2022, the nurse index in Ås/Follo was 4.1%.

Furthermore, it is crucial to work preventively against exclusion and create good support systems for those who fall through the cracks. After all, many of those who are homeless today receive social assistance or disability benefits, as well as many who are dependent on substances. It is essential to get more people into employment, increase social assistance, and help people out of addiction.

Feeling down? Got a bun in the oven? Maybe you miss your mum? Not to worry, the Health Station welcomes you with open arms. Even though you have to walk a bit longer to find them.

The Health Station for youth and students in Ås is a free, easy-access health service for youth in Ås and all students who pay tuition fees to NMBU. Here, you can get help if you have problems with your mental health, lifestyle or sexuality. A whole department of heroes works every day to help you and me back on our feet.

New wrapping, same content

Before Christmas, you could easily pop by the Health Station on your way to the supermarket. You just went around the corner by Ås Kafé, through a door and up some stairs. Now, the whole preventive unit of the municipality has been moved to Moer Health House, an almost 15-minute walk from the town centre. The reason for moving it? Politicians saving money. The Health Station is now in a municipal building.

Even though the furniture and the practice stayed the same, maybe the bar for seeking help has raised slightly when the station has moved further away from the students' "hot spots"? Well, yes and no. The Health Station might have been closer before, but now you don't have to show everyone that you're seeking help.

I pop by to check out the new place. The nursing home glows in the winter dark like a fever dream-like version of Soria Moria.

Once you have entered, you just follow the signs, like a DNT-hike in Rondane. I am guided through a corridor, up some stairs (or a lift, for accessibility), through another corridor, and I am at my destination.

A whiteboard of post-it notes with different times signals that there are still free spots. I pick one and sit down in the new waiting room, both more spacious and nicer than the previous one. After a short wait, it's my turn. A staff of experts are ready to assist: Four psychologists, three nurses, two doctors, one family therapist, one health secretary and one midwife with a specialisation in sexology are working at the Health Station. The expertise is broad and competent, and you quickly realise that these guys really want to help, and that they know what they are doing.

What kind of help can you get?

As mentioned, this service is mostly a preventive measure, where you are equipped with tools to deal with your daily life. It is perfect for you if you need advice or support dealing with your sexuality, domestic life, identity, STDs (sexually transmitted disease), difficult thoughts, grief, unhappiness, eating difficulties, sleep difficulties, substance abuse problems, stress, problems with overweight or mild psychological issues. The coverage area is broad, and if something is bothering you, it might be a good idea to pay them a visit. After all, what have you got to lose?

But the Health Station cannot fix everything. If you need long-term treatment from a psychologist, this is not the place, nor is it the place for emergencies. If the matter

is urgent, you need to call the emergency room or an ambulance.

The drop-in solution is quite clever. Every Monday between 08:30-11:00, and every Wednesday between 14:30-19:00, you can just walk in for an appointment. Usually, the nurses are doing the consultations, and you have half an hour. If that's not enough, you get another appointment another day. You can also get in touch by email or phone to book an appointment. The contact information is listed on the website of Ås municipality. The wait is about 2-3 weeks, a lot less than in the big, scary world outside of the student bubble, where everything costs money.

Pia, nurse and team leader, is telling me everything. She uses the opportunity to mention that they offer free testing for chlamydia and gonorrhoea, two STDs rapidly increasing in our age group. She makes it clear that you can get lots of free condoms in different sizes, types and tastes at the Health Station. The slogan is clear: "Use condoms!"



Easily accessible and free

How does this work? And how can it be free? I went to the AU-office to find out. The leader, Wilhelm Anthun, explains that The Health Station is mandatory by law for a municipality, and it has to be free. In Ås, SiÅs and NMBU pitch in with money, so that this service also applies to all university students. Therefore, the Health Station works closely with NMBU and SiÅs.

The Student Lounge

Do you need someone to talk to, or do you have questions about the life as a student? Directly next to the Student Post Office, in the middle of campus, you find the Student Lounge (Studentlivssenteret). You can come here between 11 and 15 Monday-Friday. Here, you get a warm welcome from Marit Raaf, whether you have any questions or just need a little break. Every Thursday 18-21, the Student Lounge has an “open house”-policy. They serve waffles and snacks, and they arrange arts and crafts, board games, quiz, Viking Chess tournaments and other activities.

The Health Station is involved in many of the gatherings and courses arranged by the Student Lounge, for these activities to get some academic believability. Examples are courses on sleep, courses for leaders of associations and courses on how to talk to large groups of people. These courses are always free and can be very useful for the rest of your time as a student.

Putting student health on the agenda

In the AU-office, Wilhelm and Martine Bingen talk about student health as something hugely important, especially considering the discouraging results of the SHoT-survey. “All this is part of the challenges with mental health. This is important to prevent, with the Health Station as an important safety net”, says Martine. She points out that it is almost more important to make sure all students feel like they master something, that they have meaning in their life and they feel like they belong socially during their time as students, so that nobody is left out. Arenas like Samfunnet, association life, the faculties, the Student Lounge, sports

and the gym, should give the students a manageable and inspiring everyday life. A new edition this year is the certificate “Open association”, given to associations without entry requirements, so that they are spotted more easily.

Both AU and SiÅs work every day to make sure the life as a student is manageable and rewarding, so that you don't feel like you're left out. But in case it happens, having a safety net to help you back on your feet is crucial, says Martine.

That the Health Station includes students, is a bonus, says Wilhelm. He describes it as a clever partnership, where NMBU and SiÅs make the academic community bigger, and the service better for both youth and students. But because the service for students is not mandated by law, it is vulnerable to the shrinking budgets. In 2024, the government reduces the funding for mental health services for students. This might mean that they have to “use the cheese slicer” on some of the positions. Wilhelm can, however, assure us that this service will continue to exist at least until 2025.

“We have arranged protests to keep the Health Station before, when they have considered budget cuts,” say Wilhelm. “But it can be difficult to justify that the municipality should spend money on us, rather than families with children for example,” he admits. Many students don't officially move to Ås, therefore free healthcare services for them are costly for the municipality.

Head of SiÅs Pål Magnus Løken pops by and enters the conversation. He says SiÅs works to make sure the students get the services they need. He points out that a grand total of 500 students officially moved to Ås last year, therefore the municipality receives almost 18 million NOK more from the government. This money should be sufficient to keep the Health Station services at an acceptable level, he says.

Let's hope he is right, and that the municipality, NMBU and SiÅs will defend these fantastic services with their heart and soul. And remember – you can always pop by the Student Lounge or the Health Station if you need someone to talk to. The bar couldn't be lower.



Confront the Monday crash!

With the SHoT survey conducted in 2023 on mental disorders among students, where 50.1% of students stated that they struggled mentally during the year, it is clearly necessary to have more concrete offers that we can make use of. ESN now hopes to be a positive contributor with its grant to Samfunnet's semester program: Monthly Mental Health Monday. But who exactly is ESN? And what can they offer you?

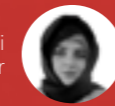
Not just for international students

ESN stands for Erasmus Student Network and is an organization that works to present international students and create opportunities for cultural understanding. I meet Maryam, Mads, Divya and Ibrahim, who all hold various positions on the board of ESN Ås. They say that, contrary to popular belief, ESN is not just for international students; Norwegian students are equally welcome in the community!

Although Monthly Mental Health Monday is completely new to Samfunnet's semester program, it is not as new to ESN Ås. They have already held two similar events during last year, one of which took place during NMBU's Mental Health Week in October. ESN Ås is happy to be able to continue the concept, now in collaboration with Samfunnet, with the hope of reaching even more students.

Interactive workshops and community

Monthly Mental Health Monday will take place in the Meeting Room at Samfunnet on a selected Monday each month throughout the semester. ESN Ås says that at these events the students will be able to take part in various workshops, where they can, among other things, learn techniques to release stress and process mental challenges in everyday life. The workshops will be highly interactive, where students will be able to participate in group work and mental exercises both to learn and to create a safe community. A nice cure for the typical Monday slump.

Certification in mental training

ESN Ås says that the board's president, Navneet Sharma, is the initiator behind the whole concept. “The start-up of mental health workshops stemmed from a genuine concern for the challenges international students who come to Norway face - navigating a foreign country, weather and diverse student cultures”, says Sharma. He therefore underwent training through ESN's Eduk8 program to certify himself as a mental trainer in November 2022, and now wants to make the offer of mental training relevant to all NMBU students.

A good investment in everyday life?

The workshops will last around two hours, so it's not a lot of time to pay a month for some guided stress relief! ESN Ås clarifies that they cannot promise any mental healing for the participants, but Maryam says that they at least want to create a safe environment for the students to talk together, relax and meditate. It is recommended to follow ESN Ås's social media for more detailed meeting times and topics for each workshop. The first workshop takes place February 12th at 17:00, so come to the meeting room and get a good mental starting point for the semester!

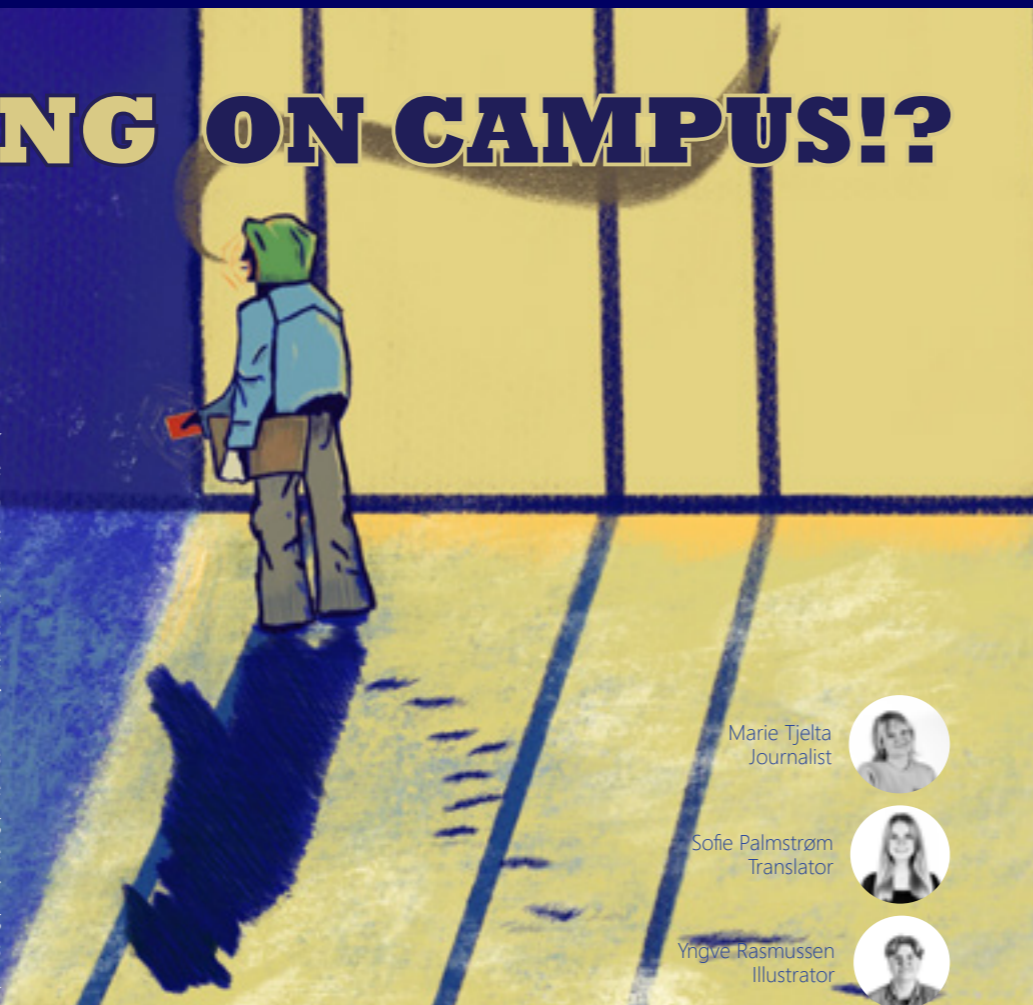

SPYING ON CAMPUS!?

Towards the end of the January block, I found myself sitting inside NIBIO waiting for a friend who had an exam. It didn't take long before I was asked who I was and what I was doing there, only to be thrown out of the building because waiting for someone was not a good enough reason to be inside the building. The justification was that stronger security measures have been initiated lately, and who has access to NMBU's buildings has become very strict. I am far from the only student who has experienced being 'thrown out', encountering more and more locked doors, losing security access on their student card, and generally experiencing stricter security on campus. Why is this happening and could it be related to a Russian spy?

Russian Illegalist at UiT

In early October 2022, a visiting researcher at the University of Tromsø was charged with espionage. After much deliberation, it was revealed that the visiting researcher from Brazil, under the name José Assis Giammaria, was actually Mikahail Valerijevitsj Mikusjin from Russia, seeking Norwegian state secrets. PST (the Norwegian Police Security Service) believes that Mikusjin is an illegalist, meaning a person who has built up an identity as a regular citizen while working undercover for a foreign intelligence agency. PST's investigation uncovered that Mikusjin received his education from GRU. GRU, not the gruesome, but rather Russia's military intelligence known for training illegal spies. Mikusjin is now charged with serious espionage of state secrets, carrying a penalty of up to 10 years. The rector at UiT stated in the newspaper iTromsø that this is a case of espionage on a completely different and far more advanced level than what they have seen before.

Another security political situation

Alright, but what does this have to do with me, you might wonder? It's rumored that a

more tightly guarded campus is a measure against espionage. To get to the bottom of this, Tuntreet contacted NMBU's security officer, Bård Martin Tollefsen. "It's clear that one becomes more alert when hearing about such an event as in Tromsø; it's a very special case," Tollefsen explains. But fear not, he reassures us that there is no reason to believe that such a thing is happening at NMBU. "That being said, the security political situation around us has changed significantly over the past 2 years, and we must be more vigilant and aware of what is happening around us - including at NMBU." Could this be why we weren't allowed into the hall during the grand prix?

The security of students and staff

Despite the rumors, Tollefsen will not say that a Russian spy at UiT has had any direct impact on NMBU's security work. When students encounter a red light when scanning their student card to access their lab, it's more due to the fact that the faculties have undergone a 'value assessment.' That is, identifying which information or resources are important for the institution and then assessing threats and vulnerabilities that could affect their security. This likely led to those responsible

for laboratories tightening the requirements for who should have access and at what times of day. These are measures to safeguard the security of individual students and staff, Tollefsen emphasizes.

NMBU is an open university

Finally, Tollefsen concludes that NMBU is an open university, and that's something they want to continue to be to the greatest extent possible. "While we want to be as open as possible, we also need to restrict access to some areas. We have a lot of important work going on at NMBU, and we know that other nations are interested in acquiring it. Therefore, we must also protect our assets."

So, it might be wise to keep your eyes open in this time we live in with a new security-political landscape. However, there's no reason to fear that espionage will happen at NMBU in the near future. Even though it might feel frustrating to encounter a locked door, it's important to remember that security measures are primarily in place to protect students and staff. But then comes the big question, what about me, when I have to do lab experiments at 3 am the day before the deadline?

New payment solution at Samfunnet!

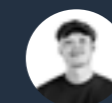

Late autumn 2023, it was made clear that Samfunnet and UKA I Ås' supplier of payment services, Espos, no longer wanted to renew their current agreement with today's terms. A tenacious hunt was thus started to ensure a new payment solution before the students returned for their January block; today it is possible to pay with ordinary bank cards through Zettle from PayPal, the latest in a long row of payment solutions.

The 17th of November 2023, KS Bank for UKA i Ås, Ezizgol Rezai, met with Espos to negotiate a new agreement for UKA 2024. It was in this meeting that Espos, supplier of the payment solution DiggiPay, made it clear that they no longer wished to renew the agreements with the current terms. Ezizgol tells that the kind price “was taken for granted”, with good terms due to the mobile terminals which were part of a three year long pilot program.

After the meeting, it was clarified in an email thread that the termination would also include Samfunnet. Thus, over a short time period, we would lose the 16 terminals and be left with no payment solutions when the students returned from their Christmas holiday.

Håkon Kvernstuen, Head of Finance at Samfunnet, and Magnus Aalde, Head of Finance for UKA i Ås, can tell us about the busy days after receiving the news. “There was a crisis meeting with UKA and Samfunnet, where we agreed to go our separate ways and see what we could find.” As a response to this, there was also an urgent meeting with the Board of House and Finance, the advisory and financial governing body at Studentsamfunnet. Håkon tells that the Board of House and Finance was as shocked as the two Heads of Finance, but that they remained calm: “They were probably a bit more in the mindset that everything would be okay.”

With the Board of House and Finance’ full support, and armed with a month to find and sign a new agreement, they went to work. Normally, these larger investments take a long time to settle with several offer rounds, but in this case all parties were set on finding something, fast. Finally, they found the solution Zettle by PayPal, which makes it possible to pay with normal bank cards. This is also a better solution for international students, since DiggiPay required a Norwegian bank account and Vipps to refill your card. Although the transition to a new payment solution wasn’t planned well in advance, a new solution was quickly found and implemented smoothly.

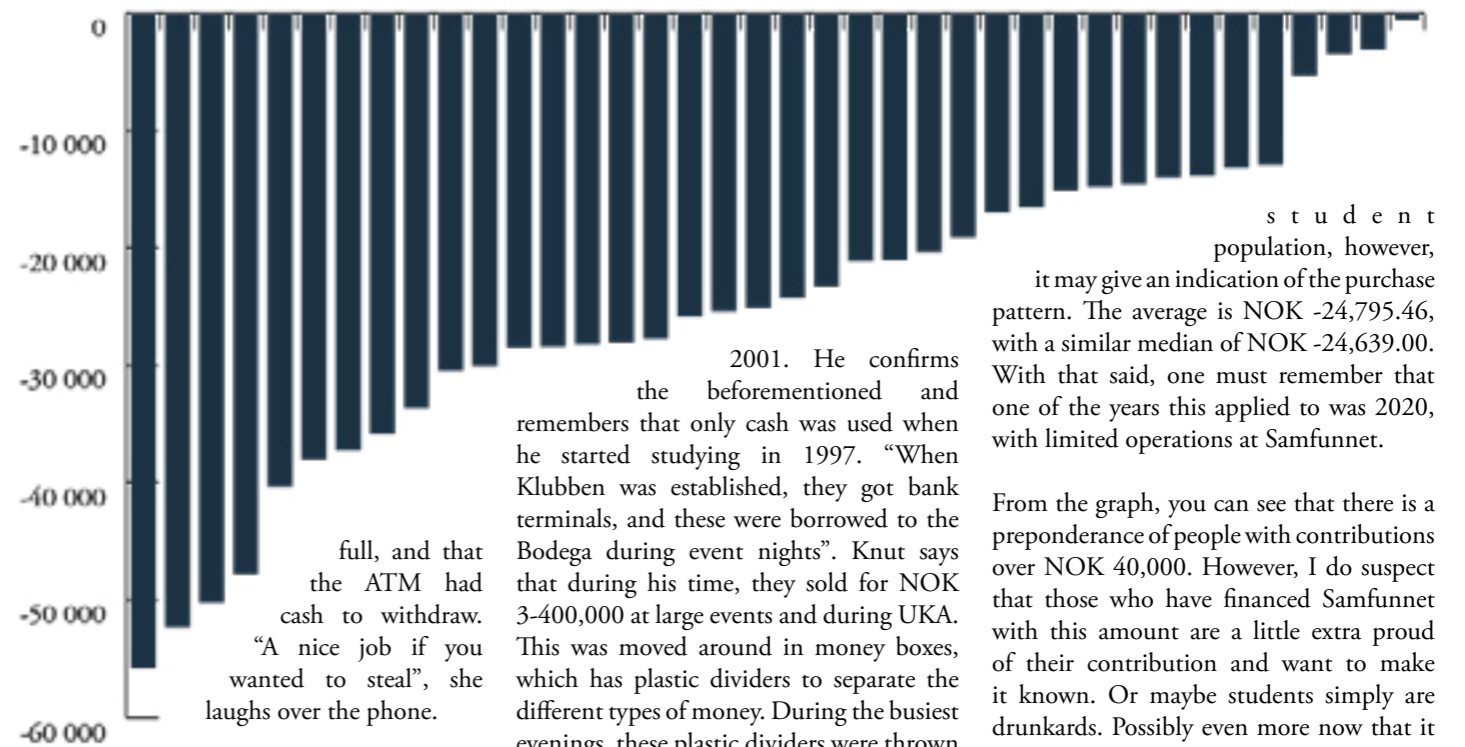
Håkon asked the question you may be wondering yourself: “Why didn’t we start earlier?” One of the reasons is that Zettle is a very new system. Magnus would also like to emphasise that, until now, Espos has been very helpful with any problems, it has been cheap, and in return Samfunnet has acted as a test lab.

This is by no means the first time a payment solution has been changed at Samfunnet. Until 2019, the Cashless service was used. This solution was also provided by Espos, and is very similar to its successor, DiggiPay. The difference is that you had to top up money at special terminals, either with cash or later by card. Cashless as a solution was first tried during UKA i Ås 2010, and in January 2012 Samfunnet also started using

it. Before this, cash was mainly used, with some use of bank terminals during UKA and larger events.

Håkon Johansen was the Leader of Samfunnet from autumn 2011 to spring 2012 and says that the reason for switching to Cashless was largely due to cards not working well in practice. He also tells us that he was somewhat worried about robberies: “There was an awful lot of cash in circulation!” After each event, the cash was counted, and the event manager had to bring money of up to several hundred thousand after the largest events to the safe in the center of Ås. “Someone who knew about this could bring a knife and leave with a lot of money”, says the former leader thoughtfully. A specific incident is mentioned, where a volunteer snuck away larger sums of cash. Stories of people ordering beer, then cancelling the payment and running away before they could be caught are also mentioned. This was without a doubt built as a trust based Samfunnet.

Kaja Heltorp was Head of Administration for UKA in 2008, and echoes Håkon’s statements. Nevertheless, she believes that Håkon was probably more worried than she was. Kaja is from Skjeberg and “hadn’t heard of crime”. She continues to talk about bank volunteers who ran around with notes to ensure that the terminals always had enough cash to exchange without being too



2001. He confirms the beforementioned and remembers that only cash was used when he started studying in 1997. “When Klubben was established, they got bank terminals, and these were borrowed to the Bodega during event nights”. Knut says that during his time, they sold for NOK 3-400,000 at large events and during UKA. This was moved around in money boxes, which has plastic dividers to separate the different types of money. During the busiest evenings, these plastic dividers were thrown out and the money stuffed in to make room for everything. It was difficult to balance so that there was always enough cash. If many people wanted to use the ATM, there had to be enough in the safes, but not at the expense of storing an unnecessary and unsafe amount of cash.

full, and that the ATM had cash to withdraw. “A nice job if you wanted to steal”, she laughs over the phone.

Kaja says that there was great resistance against transitioning to Cashless in the beginning, partly because of the costs of getting an av card. Even so, she sees it as a necessary change. “Cash is actually a bloody bad idea”, chuckles Kaja, when she thinks back to how they were doing things. At this time, there was a booth with a staffed ATM in the Bodega entrance. Kaja clearly remembers that it was stated in the event instructions that the people doing community service there should not be “airheaded”. In other words, it should be someone organized that could be trusted.

What really took time before Cashless was the counting of cash. Hanna Fuglseth, who was the Head of Finance at Samfunnet in 2007, remembers that there were always two people who counted the money in the Samfunnet-office (now the NU-office) after the event was done. It was usually people from the Bodega Consolidation on Wednesdays and the Board of Samfunnet on Fridays who counted the money. There was some limited use of bank terminals, at larger events and during UKA. She recalls that the terminals were expensive, and that you had to have a subscription from the dealer.

When Hanna was in the Board of Samfunnet, she also sat in the Board of House and Finance with, among others, Knut Damm Lyngstad. He was also Head of Finance at Samfunnet, albeit in

A COMMENT ON THE REVIEW OF THE DÅS-REVUE

On the occasion of our ten years-anniversary, the FÅRshow-committee saved two seats for Tuntreet on the front row in Aud.Max. The last time we had a show, we didn't get any mention in Tuntreet, and we thought that was a shame. In retrospect, this was probably not a negative thing after all. Because even though we received some praise, I am left with some thoughts that I would like to share.

As revealed in the review, one of the sketches in the revue was about the fact that we can no longer dance without the focus being on sex. The review by Tuntreet is one of several reasons why the sketch addresses precisely this problem. Because after sitting through over fifty minutes of couple dancing, hip hop, sing-alongs, modern dance, voguing, six sketches and nine clips, it is still sex that is chosen to be in focus.

Sex is often a theme in association revues, and usually to a much greater extent than in this year's DÅs show. Nevertheless, the review introduces DÅs as an association where "the dancing often plays on some sexy moves", and one of the main points it highlights is that we play on sex.

In the review, the audience is even used to point this out. During the revue, the two middle tables on the first row were filled with family members and former DÅs members. The remaining tables in front of the stage were reserved for the associations that, themselves, held seats for us during their revues, which we consider to be normal custom. In the review, however, this is twisted so to portray that these associations have been invited because they are male associations that we want to "be front row witnesses to butt-shaking and sex-appeal". This is anti-

feminist and misunderstood and shows once again what we try to get across in the sketch, as well as its importance: it is not possible to dance without dancing to make men think you are attractive.

Further on in the review, the journalist writes that she only had consumed one beer during the show. Then it's a bit strange that she hasn't picked up on the hot topics that were brought up, when we included everything from the Barbie movie to Moksnes.

Equally strange is it that she hasn't only managed to misunderstand the whole point of the sketch, but even contributes to strengthen the idea that dancing is synonymous with a desire to show off one's body to men. The fact that a woman wrote the review makes it even worse, if you ask me.

And by all means, if you don't think the revue is funny or think we have too much dancing and too few sketches, that is a subjective opinion which is quite natural to come out in a review. Constructive criticism is a good thing, and we are fully aware that criticism is something all associations receive after holding a review.

What's a shame is that the review doesn't have any sense of humour whatsoever, but rather pure dissatisfaction at times. You start to wonder what the point of writing such a review is, because if there's one thing it doesn't do, it's to motivate you to want to put on a show.

And what does Tuntreet really have to gain from writing such reviews about voluntary student work?

By the way, our revue is now out on Youtube (and Pornhub, ofc), so if you want to see all our sexual dancing again, you know where to go.

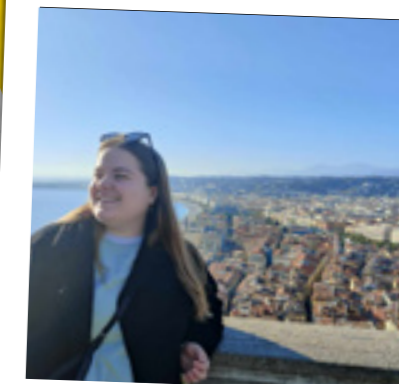

Outside of the casino where James Bond melted our fragile hearts.



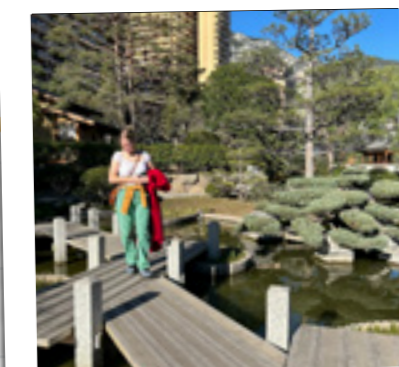
The pleasure of enjoying two nice views at the same time :)

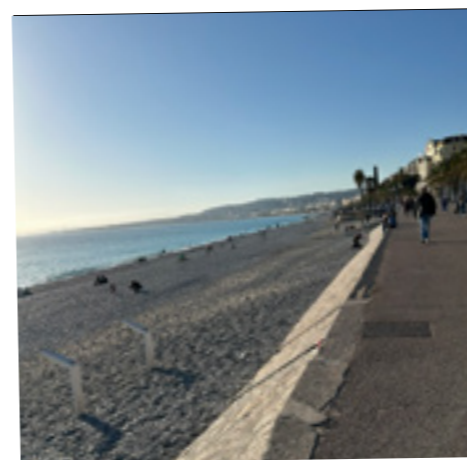

Thanks to everyone who contributes, most of us have a great skiing offer right outside our doorstep! Ås municipality operates the large trail-making machine, which creates space for both skating, classic skiing, and those who want to ski side by side with each other. Ås IL Ski also voluntarily provides the big machine when the municipality is unable to, and a smaller trail-making machine where it fits better. "Kroerløypas venner" (the friends of Kroerløypa) take responsibility for the Kroerløypa trail. On behalf of all us students in Ås, who enjoy the ski trails and experience increased quality of life thanks to the efforts to maintain the trail network in Ås; a heartfelt thank you!

Information

To stay updated on recently groomed ski trails and to get information about where the "newly groomed" trails are, the iMarka app is very useful. It's especially handy to have on the trip if you decide on the route along the way. The smaller trail-making machine does not have real-time GPS marking, but if you follow Ås IL Ski's Facebook page, you'll get information on what's been groomed. If you're not so keen on smartphones, Skiforeningen.no is a place to check trail status without slipping when looking at the phone screen!

How?

If you don't have skis of your own, or perhaps forgot them after a hopefully relaxing and low-stress Christmas break? Fear not, through organizations like NMBUI, you can rent cross-country skis and equipment! If you want to glide with as good grip and glide as you have in the rest of your student life, there's no need to stress about waxing! Students are not only kleptomaniacs but are happy to share most things if you just ask nicely! It never hurts to ask someone in the collective.

Where?

There are many different trails you can take, but they are not always prepared, so it's wise to check before you go.

The start of the ski trip from Pentagon can begin from either Kjerringjordet/Vollebekkjordet or Søråsjordet/Prærien. Both are also nice trails to walk as short trips to get out! They both also lead onto Vestbyrunden (11 km), depending on

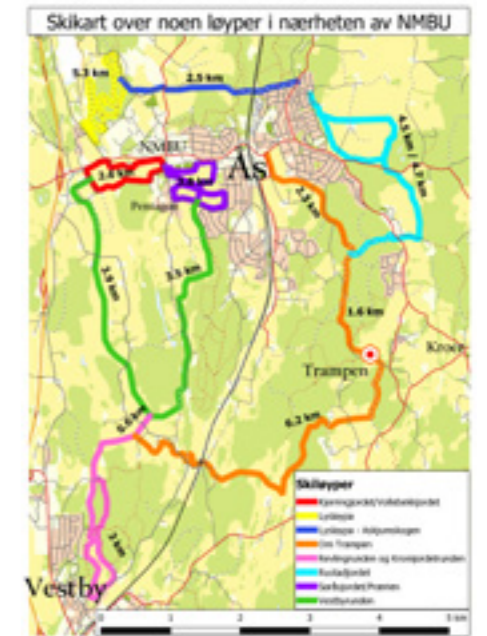
which way you want to go. This one is partly marked and mostly runs through fields and some patches of forest. It's a nice trip in varied terrain and has many open areas where you get a great overview from the fields. If you want a longer trip on Vestbyrunden, you can take the detour south of Revlingrunden and Kromjordet. Here you walk further south and end up in Vestby after a lovely forest-covered ski trip, where you can combine the joy of skiing with a quick trip to Holdbart. If you'd rather go for a trip away from housing, with the possibility of Sunday waffles, you can take the same detour south from Vestbyrunden and head east towards Trampen. Along the way, you pass the Sunday-open scout cabin Trampen, which also has its own Facebook page. The cabin is operated by Ås scout group and is open for the sale of delicious waffles, soda, and coffee every Sunday from 11 am to 3 pm until March. From Trampen, you can continue east on the route around Kroerløypa (14-17 km), which is marked and signposted. You can also enter Kroerløypa from the Trampen trail, where it starts on the east side of the railway tracks near Ås town center. Here you can choose to take the shorter route around Rustadjordet, which offers a good view of the fields to the east. If you're not so keen on skiing with a headlamp when darkness falls in the afternoon, both the illuminated trail in Nordskogen (6 km) and the passage through Aschjemskogen will be perfect for you.

The big question is - can you ski all the way to Ski? Possibly, if you're willing to make your own tracks, or others have done it for you. Skiing doesn't really have much to do with the town of Ski, fundamentally. It comes from the Norse "skeid," which means a race involving horses, something you rarely find with skis on their hooves...

Closing remarks on the weather

Winter activity options in Ås are very good - as long as the weather permits. At the time of writing, it's cold and the snow is falling heavily. Yours truly is sitting in a basement apartment in Kringla and is having trouble opening the bedroom window to air out the sleeping

air, simply because the window is snowed in. Our beloved weather forecaster, Yr, predicts mild weather and rain for the next few weeks, so I'm crossing my fingers and toes (and skis and poles) that Yr is wrong. Professor Hans-Christan Teien explains in an interview published on the NMBU website that the fish deaths are due to a lack of oxygen in the water. This is due to the

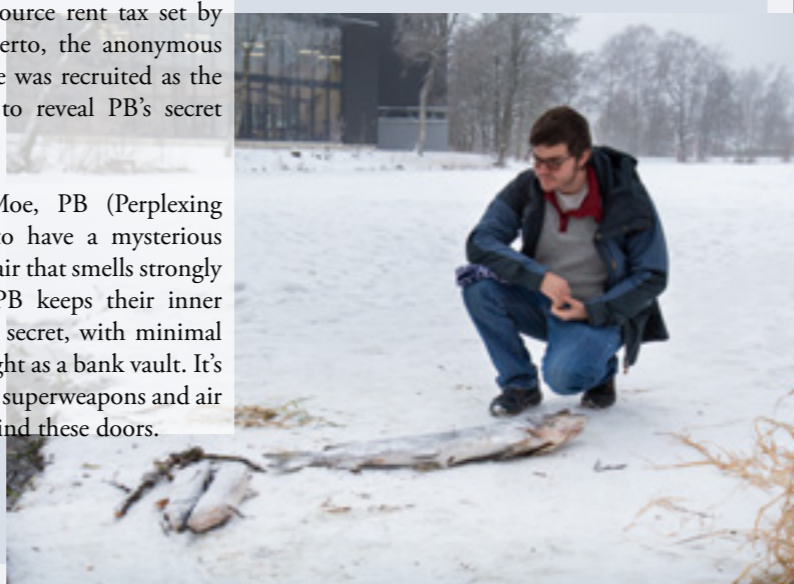

Samfunnets Grand Prix What went wrong?

When Samfunnet's Grand Prix was held in November of 2023, a lot didn't go as planned. Mistakes were made which resulted in hundreds of students not being able to watch the show they paid for. Did Samfunnet have control? If so, how could this happen?

Choice by tradition

We got in touch with Samfunnet, and asked why it went so wrong that November night and got a well-rounded answer from the board. They start by explaining the choice of using Festsalen. Historically speaking, Samfunnet's Grand Prix has gone down in Festsalen. The autumn of 2022 was an exception, it was held in Aud. Max. as a farewell before it was renovated (That has not happened, due to the increasing prices on electricity).

The choice of using Festsalen for Grand Prix 2023 has its roots in tradition. But the saying goes "traditions should be broken". This could have been a good piece of advice in this situation, as Samfunnet saw that Grand Prix in Aud. Max. was possible. But what stopped them from repeating this success?

It seems Samfunnet had two options: organise it in Aud. Max. with capacity for 600 students or sell less tickets and use Festsalen. Samfunnet explains that there is a lot of work behind deciding how many

tickets to sell for an event. It is based on an analysis of how many tickets were sold for previous events. In the case of Grand Prix, the number of tickets sold doubled from 350 in 2022. The Board of Samfunnet points out that this is an important comparison to make. This does not, however, explain why they sold three times as many tickets as the capacity of the room.

Why did they sell so many tickets?

The board defends this by saying that the number of tickets is based on the house's total capacity. Guests rarely stay put in one room; they move around the house. This might be true for a regular night, but

Grand Prix is a special event where most people plan on watching the show rather than sitting in the Bodega.

The board accepts this criticism and says that at events that are in high demand and put pressure on certain rooms like Festsalen, they have to look at different solutions so that it doesn't affect the guests or the people working negatively. They end by saying that they always appreciate feedback and constructive criticism.

If you attended the Grand Prix this autumn, it was maybe a disappointing experience; when you performed without your friends

in the audience, when you couldn't cheer for your association, when you worked and had to handle way too many people or when you just didn't get to enjoy the more unique shows at Samfunnet.

Maybe this situation shows that Samfunnet needs a bigger version of Festsalen, maybe they need to use Aud. Max. more for their events or maybe they just need better routines for what kind of adjustments and calculations must be made for such events. But one thing is for certain, this was a miscalculation, and the flood could have been prevented.

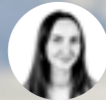
VILDE KJELSRUD PEDERSEN

Not because of egoism, but because what she has to share about herself carries such an important message that she can't help but share it. More on this later.

After high school and a couple of years spent at a “folkehøyskole” in Alta, working, and taking up courses, Vilde ended up in Ås. This is almost five years ago. She initially moved into temporary housing in the basement of Kajaveien, with a car full of beer. After a while, she got a basement apartment where she lived alone, which didn't suit her as she “lives to be social.” In the midst of this, she also experienced a tough heartbreak, leading her to often seek comfort back home in Gjøvik. Therefore, she couldn't fully embrace the Ås community in the beginning. Fortunately, she met a group of girls at Ås early during the buddy week, who contributed to making the first year both fun and enjoyable. Just as she felt ready to participate more, the pandemic hit, but this didn't stop her from getting involved in the social life of Samfunnet and Ås.

An Instagram post about job openings motivated her to apply for a position she saw as tailor-made for her – the HR manager, a job she now says she loved. As HR manager, Vilde focused on being visible, even with a lot of people to manage and many responsibilities. She emphasizes the importance of committee leaders communicating the issues of committee members to her. She aimed for a low threshold for addressing both positive and challenging matters. The result was that she had the opportunity to help many people precisely because she managed to be visible. Visibility didn't necessarily have to be physical but could also be achieved by, for example, ending all emails with “remember to let me know if there's anything.”

Most people in Ås probably know her primarily as the former leader at Samfunnet, a role she held from 2022 to 2023. Vilde also sits, as one of six people, on the Ethics Committee. The committee is currently working on developing ethical guidelines that will eventually be applied at Studentsamfunnet, to be presented at Samfunnets general meeting in the spring of 2024. Vilde has also previously been Head of the Buddy Week and is now going to Bergen in February as a student ambassador for NMBU to try to persuade high school students to apply here. In other words, Vilde has taken on quite a few different roles and jobs, all of which require a certain level of care.

Care is also a word she chooses to highlight in describing herself. Throughout almost her entire time in Ås, she has had responsibilities for or represented students. She comes across as a person who has the energy to make an effort for those around her. She is very cheerful and smiles almost throughout the entire interview. One might think that she would close up a bit since this is an interview focused solely on her, but in Vilde's case, it's the opposite. So far in the interview, I am not yet aware that Vilde has a somewhat different story than most, but she is very open about it, as if it is the most natural thing in the world.

When Vilde was in high school, her father took his own life after struggling with mental illness for a couple of years. Vilde and her family immediately chose openness, and she returned to school almost immediately after the incident. She simply couldn't bear to stay at home in her own grief. Vilde describes the support of her friend group in Gjøvik as absolutely essential during this period and for the transition back to normal life. At Vilde's home, they also had an “open house” policy so that people could drop by for a chat and remember the one they had lost. Vilde also takes some time to remember her father during the interview, describing him as a very fair person towards others and someone who, she believes, would be “pissed off” by today's worldview, such as the Western ignorance towards current wars. This sense of justice is something Vilde has carried with her.

Vilde mentions that many people around them, in the period after her father's death, used to tell them that they were so strong. Vilde hated this and explains, “this is a situation we have to face; you can't escape it, and we're just trying to survive.” She understood that people meant well, and she appeared grateful, but at the same time, it was “damn annoying.” She wanted to be Vilde, not “Vilde who lost her father.” At the same time, she acknowledges that the reason people saw her and her family as strong was the openness they had chosen and her decision to handle everyday life in the same way as before. For her own part, she looks back on some of the choices she made shortly after her father's death as a detour from facing the painful things.

The openness she chose around her father's death was new for Vilde. While her father was mentally ill, she would often explain to her friends that his problems were just "stress at work." She felt it was a taboo topic for herself. When he died, there was no alternative; openness was the most natural choice. However, she is honest that in recent times, especially every October, the month her father died, she has found it very challenging. In the last couple of years, she has experienced episodes of dissociation and difficulty, describing what she went through as retraumatization. She needed her friends around her to realize how bad she was feeling and that she should seek a psychologist. Vilde emphasizes again the importance of her friends in Gjøvik and Ås, acknowledging that they've had very open conversations about how everyone is doing.

Vilde highlights her mother as exceptional. Vilde's mother is a therapist, and it seems like Vilde has inherited good communication skills when it comes to discussing sensitive topics. Vilde shares an incident from the beginning of elementary school where there was a boy in her class who only wanted to be under his desk; he didn't want to play and was afraid to be outside with the others. Vilde and her friend couldn't understand this behavior. Out of curiosity, Vilde told her mother about it, and her mother suggested, "but can you go under the table and play with him there?" The next day, Vilde and her friend did exactly what her mother had suggested, and it worked. The three even became close friends later on. Therefore, she believes that the understanding of other people's situations and curiosity about it are things she inherited from her mother.

Curiosity is a word Vilde strongly identifies with, and she believes that openness in one direction contributes to openness in others. She can ask people the most direct questions and she thinks that it's important to be able to ask someone directly, "do you have suicidal thoughts?" She believes that no one takes their own life because of the question. One might think that a more therapeutically oriented education would have suited Vilde better, but it ended up being biology. When asked about her choice of education, she says that she is very interested in how biology is connected to psychology and the environment, and vice versa. However, she is currently working on how sediments

affect fish eggs in rivers, so she is definitely interested in other things beside people. But the fact that she studies biology and is also interested in mechanisms and evolutionary biology testifies to a curiosity about humans and organisms that is even deeper than most.

For Vilde, the end of her time in Ås is approaching, something she describes as "wistful." The effort she has put into Samfunnet (also in the literal sense of the word) has undoubtedly been immensely important. For example, the impact of her efforts will likely be seen when the ethical guidelines for Studentsamfunnet eventually come into effect. Every organization needs someone who stands out, someone who dares to go under the table to the person who doesn't dare go anywhere else. Vilde is that person.

Low threshold and intimate WITH TWO IN THE ARSE, ONE IN THE PUSSY

Do you miss your “russetid”? Then you probably enjoyed the “low-threshold concert” in Halvors Hybel at the last Wednesday-bodega in January.

Samfunnet invited us, for the first time in a long time, to a low-threshold concert during a completely normal bodega in January. We had a chat with Magnus Schie Larsen, who booked the artist of the night, to hear more about this new concept. What gives the concert its low threshold, is the fact that it's free, says Magnus. When a guy wanted to play a free concert this last autumn, Samfunnet took this opportunity to test multiple things. At this event, they could experiment with both January as the time, free entry and Halvors as the place for the concert. Halvors has not been used for a concert since the chaos-concert with Ravi during UKA22. But Magnus thinks it's a cool room that's nice to use.

About 50% of the respondents in Samfunnets last survey said they wanted a wider range of artists, rather than it being strictly commercial. Magnus says that because of this, Samfunnet works on providing a wide range of events, so that people can

trust that they “make something good”, and that Samfunnet can be a natural first choice for most people. He points out that economy is the limiting factor here. The few big concerts at Samfunnet have to be commercial to make ends meet. “If you give the concerts to not-so-well-known artists, it's difficult to get people to attend”. But he points out that the Halvors-concerts could be in addition to the bigger concerts. This way, they can make room for less-known artists.

The evening continues, and Tuntreet makes its way to Halvors Hybel, where sick tech-beats make your ribs shake. Rasmus Thall is behind the mixing table on a slightly raised plateau, while an increasingly bigger crowd forms around him. The club feeling works well, and for being his first concert, Rasmus kills it. A lot of remixes and covers, but he is a DJ after all, so we'll let that pass.



A song about clogs is pumped through the room with a rough beat, and as a lad who likes to dance, I have to admit my sense of rhythm tickles quite a bit. In front of me everyone has put their arms on each other's shoulders in camaraderie. The pack of people moves as one organism, up and down with the catchy beat. 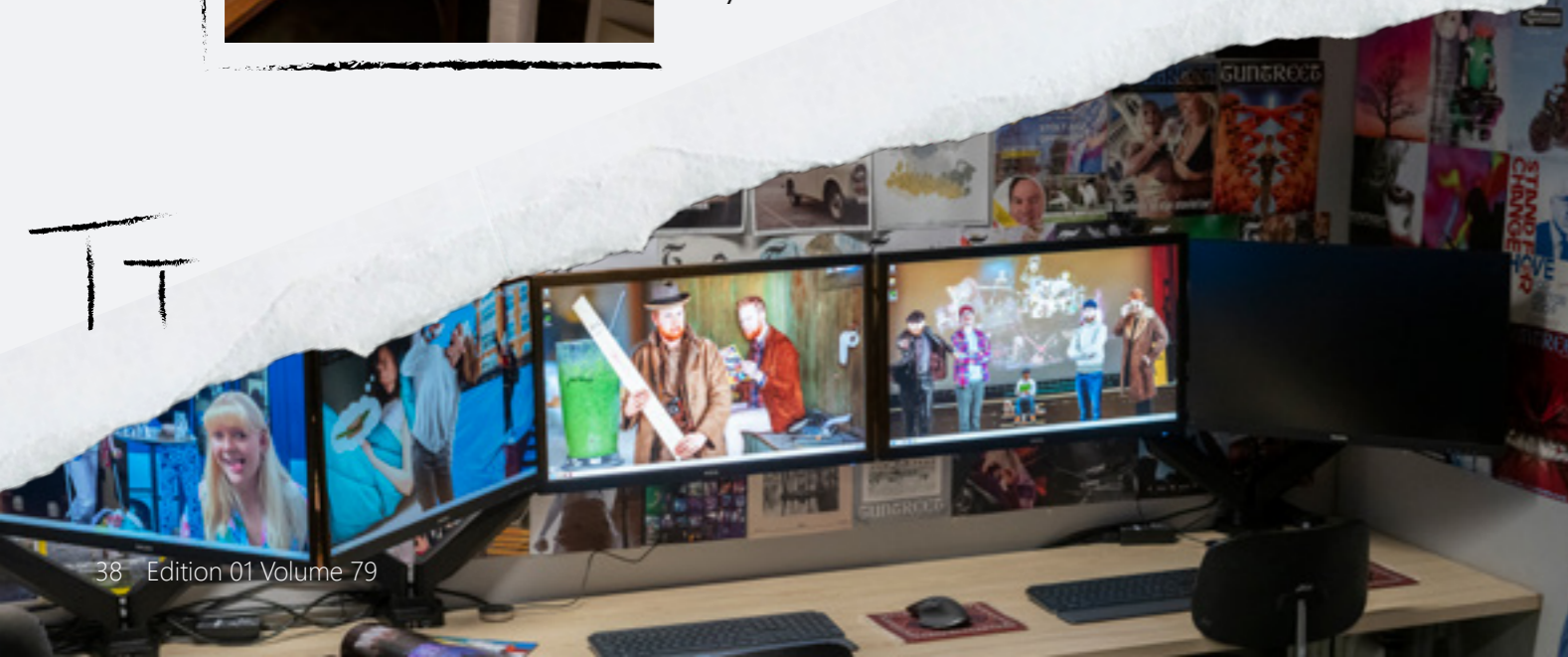


Refurbishing the TT-office

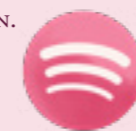

I don't know about you, but I find something hopeful in the snowy weather. We know that our climate is in a major crisis, and we know that global warming presents us with new challenges. Kjell Aksnes passed away

He is also one of the few to ever be declared an honorary member of Studentsamfunnet. He has been a resource and friend for Tuntreet until the very last. Rest in peace.

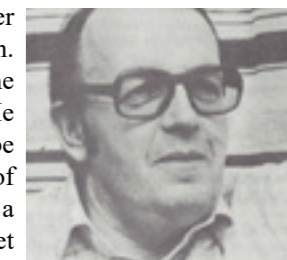

New Regulations for SiÅs Student Housing

SiÅs has acquired many more appartements in recent years, leading to the need of a more dynamic housing-allocation process that is less labor-intensive and better aligned with students' actual preferences. The regulations aim to ensure a fair housing policy.

- Housing is no longer allocated based on study credits.
- First come, first served – it is advisable to submit your application early.
- Internal exchanges are given priority.
- SiÅs will, as far as practically possible, accommodate students' preferences for choosing a single room or shared accommodation – please specify in the comment field where/with whom. This also applies to association collectives.
- The maximum housing period corresponds to the duration of the study program, limited to 6 years, with the possibility to apply for an extended period.
- Current students must have paid the semester fee and be enrolled in a regular full-time study program at NMBU to have priority for renting student housing.
- New and former NMBU students, who, at the time of submitting the housing application, have not been admitted to NMBU, can apply for housing based on their application for admission to NMBU without having paid the semester fee first.

The changes has been discussed in the SiÅs board and the student board before the final decision. The "Regulations for Student Housing" (dated 18.12.2023) were approved by the SiÅs board on 12.01.2024.



What does it take for you to use a condom?

Happy New Year, everyone. Ready for new habits in 2024?

I think NMBU students are really good at testing themselves for chlamydia!

Many have received a call from the health station about contact tracing and a course of antibiotics. Unfortunately, it's not as simple with gonorrhoea. The statistics show a 60% increase in gonorrhoea cases in 2022 and a tenfold increase compared to just a few years ago.

Unlike chlamydia, gonorrhoea can cause permanent damage to the urethra and pain. If you give birth while having gonorrhoea, the child can become blind. The bacteria are fought with an antibiotic injection in the buttocks. Gonorrhoea is also more contagious than chlamydia. The risk of transmission through unprotected intercourse is 50-70% for those with a vagina and 20-30% for those with a penis. Transmission can occur through contact with infected fingers on genitalia, oral sex, vaginal sex, and anal sex.

The extra challenge with this infection is that it doesn't always cause symptoms. For example, 50% of those with a vagina experience no symptoms. This means you could have been infected and spread the infection without knowing it.

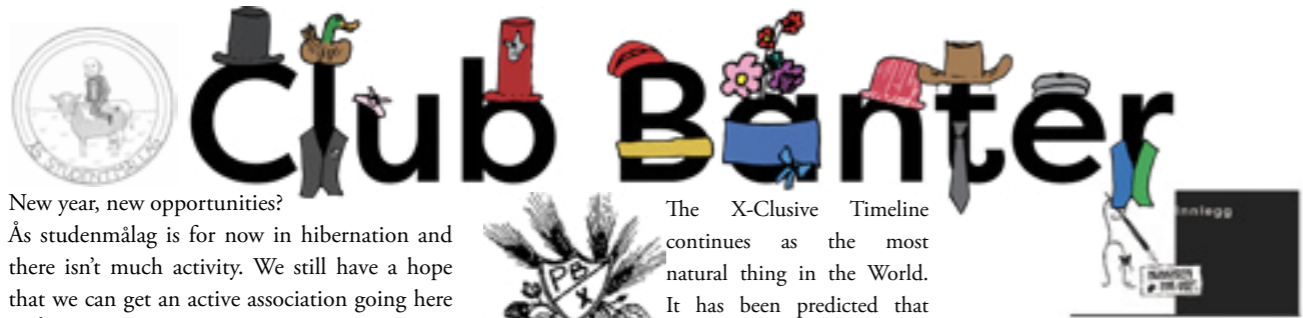
The only way to check if you have contracted gonorrhoea is to get tested. You can get tested 14 days after unprotected intercourse. The only way to protect yourself from infection is to use a condom. Use a condom as a habit! It's a natural way to protect yourself and your sexual partner. Using a condom is a gesture of care!

At the youth and student health station, you can get tested for gonorrhoea and other sexually transmitted infections for free! Here, you can also receive condoms, lubricants, and valuable advice completely free of charge!

Welcome to our health station, and remember that we are now located at Moer Health House in Tunveien 2.
